POST/TWEET 1:

Psalm 107:1-3

If you have been redeemed, you have a story to tell. Tell it. Now.

POST/TWEET 2:

Psalm 107:4-9

Find the spiritual condition and post a picture of how we see this spiritual condition today.

POST/TWEET 3:

Psalm 107:4-9

God uses the redeemed to be His feet and hands. Snap a pic of this happening with Psalm 107:9 as the caption.

POST/TWEET 4:

Psalm 107:10-11

This is a place we can find ourselves if we rebel against God's ways. He really does have our best interest at heart.

POST/TWEET 5:

Psalm 107:14-16

If you find yourself thinking you're in a dark place that's impossible to get out of, you'll find some good news here. Create a graphic that shows this taking place today.

POST/TWEET 6:

Psalm 107:23-27

The picture painted in this passage could represent any number of spiritual conditions. What do you think it represents?

POST/TWEET 7:

Psalm 107:6, 13, 19, 28

Note this pattern in these verses: 1) what the people do; 2) how God responded. Then do this: describe a time when you've experienced this pattern.

POST/TWEET 8:

Psalm 107:8, 15, 21, 31

Each of these verses chronicles the reaction to four stories of redemption. I'm sensing a pattern. What is it?

POST/TWEET 9:

Psalm 107:43

Flash Devo: Stop whatever you're doing (safely) and spend the next five minutes doing the last phrase of this verse.

Psalm 107
